- No food may be taken and resold
- ONE BAG per client strictly enforced
- ONE ITEM per client strictly enforced
- ONE frozen meat per visit
- 6 pieces of small produce
- 1 piece of large produce

*These limits will allow ALL food pantry clients to receive equal amounts of nutritious foods.*

I understand that volunteers of the Nathan Hale Veterans Outreach Centers have the right to report any abuse to these rules and risk the chance of being prohibited to use the food pantry.

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
